#### **Learn About Learning Problems**

- identify children with learning problems
- learn to communicate concerns to parents
- gain flexibility in teaching methods

## Work Together with Parents and Therapists

- Build a close relationship and good communication with parents and therapists
- Regularly share information
- Change goals and methods as needed

# Know You are the "Boss" and Don't Lose Control

- No nagging
- No whining
- No yelling



# • Look for what each child is good at and praise them daily • Know areas of weakness, look for any improvement • Equal is not always fair



- Post rules, schedules, and assignments
- Clear, enforceable rules
- Consistent routines
- Warn of schedule changes
- Communicate assignments in several ways
- Assignment book checked by teacher/ signed by parent

# Giving Directions

- Verbally and written
- Get students'
   attention
- Step-by-step
- Short sentences
- Simple vocabulary

Develop Non-verbal Cues to Manage Behaviour

#### Seating arrangement for control

- Easily distracted children close at hand
- Hyperactive children toward the edges

#### Alternatives for hyperactive children

- Stand to do work
- Do assignment at the board

#### Alternatives for dyslexic children

- Allow a faster student to be a partner and assist
- Check progress frequently

- of work area
- of supplies/ books/ book bags
